- Received Arts in The Basic Curriculum (ABC) grant and designation.

Goal #3: Actively engage community and stakeholders at Mossy Oaks Elementary School.

- Students are actively engaged in community service activities such as Encouragers Club, Relay for Life, Project Care, Adopt-a-Highway, Help of Beaufort.
- Many activities such as PTO sponsored events, Starbase, Marine Corps Band performance, Spring Cookout, Read Across America, Relay for Life, Kids’ Hope mentors, MOES Field Day, Therapy Dogs, Kids Club, Family Focus Nights, Vanderbilt University Alternative Spring Break, etc., actively engage our community and stakeholders.
- SIC continues to find ways in which to involve all parents in the life of the school.

Goal #4: Provide resources for appropriate learning environments.

- SIC assisted with the writing of the school-based budget used to purchase materials to support the learning environment and to provide professional development opportunities for staff to support the learning environment.
- SIC assisted in the writing of the Title I Budget and Title I Focus Plan, which allowed for additional funds for school support.

Goal #5: Ensure a safe and healthy learning environment.

- School “Crisis Management Plan” revised and on file in the school office.
- Lobby Guard system utilized for visitor check-in and monitoring.
- Emergency procedures reviewed with staff at the beginning of the school year.
- “Project Wisdom” character education program used to support a healthy learning environment.
- “Wise Owl Student of the Month” program in place.
- “Active Shooter Training” provided to all staff.

Goal #6: Develop practices, processes, and technologies for open, frequent, transparent and effective communication, both inside and outside the school.
